Jordan Singleton, MD, is an emergency medicine physician and a first year Epidemic Intelligence Service (EIS) officer with the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). He is assigned in the Coronavirus and Other Respiratory Viruses Division (CORVD) at the CDC and investigates viral-respiratory infections and vaccine effectiveness for respiratory viruses such as COVID and RSV.

Dr. Singleton will be presenting on the role of EIS officers in disease surveillance, research, and outbreak responses as well as the process for applying and working for the CDC EIS program. He will discuss his path to EIS and the diverse career opportunities for those interested in public health.
